

**Jewish Theological Seminary Missions to Cuba**  
**December 13 – 21, 2010; February 28 – March 8, 2011**



*Central Havana*

Jewish Museum members are invited to join a mission to Cuba under the auspices of the Jewish Theological Seminary. Participants will be traveling under an approved U.S. Treasury Department License.

**Program Details:**

Five days (six nights) in Havana; two day (one night) excursion, to Cienfuegos (a Unesco World Heritage site) and Santa Clara to meet with members of the Jewish communities in these cities. Participants will not need to check out of the hotel in Havana; [rooms will be held and only an overnight bag will be needed]. Participants will need to be in Miami the night before departure as our flight to Havana departs early the following morning (overnight at Miami airport Crowne Plaza hotel the night before departure for Havana included).

**Hotels:**

- In Havana: Melia Cohiba - a deluxe hotel, one of the finest in Havana, run by the Melia chain in Spain.
- In Cienfuegos: overnight at La Jagua or LaUnion hotels - best available in Cienfuegos.

**Trip Scholar and Leader: Enrique Levy**

Enrique Levy is a Sephardic Jew, born in Cuba of Turkish parents. A successful and highly respected businessman who lives and works in New Jersey, he was born in a sugar-mill town in the countryside of Camaguey province. Enrique was educated in Cuba and enrolled in the University of Havana where he studied until the University closed its doors because of the political situation and unrest. He came to the United States in 1956 and graduated from Louisiana State University with degrees in Chemical Engineering. Enrique, who has served as scholar to previous Jewish Museum travel programs to Cuba, is intensely interested in Sephardic and Cuban history and culture and teaches Ladino.
